# THE COMMUNITY WE SERVE

For *more than a century*, the Armed Services YMCA has focused on supporting **junior-enlisted service members and their families**, who often carry the greatest financial and operational pressures of military life.

In San Diego, home to one of the largest concentrations of military families in the country, service members and their loved ones navigate **frequent relocations, extended deployments, and demanding work schedules** that can make everyday stability harder to maintain. Many families are raising young children while building their military careers, often far from extended family and traditional support systems.

In a region where the cost of living continues to rise and access to affordable childcare and essential resources can be limited, these pressures can place **significant strain on families already adapting to the realities of military service**. As a result, community-based, mission-aligned support is a critical component of sustaining family well-being and long-term readiness.

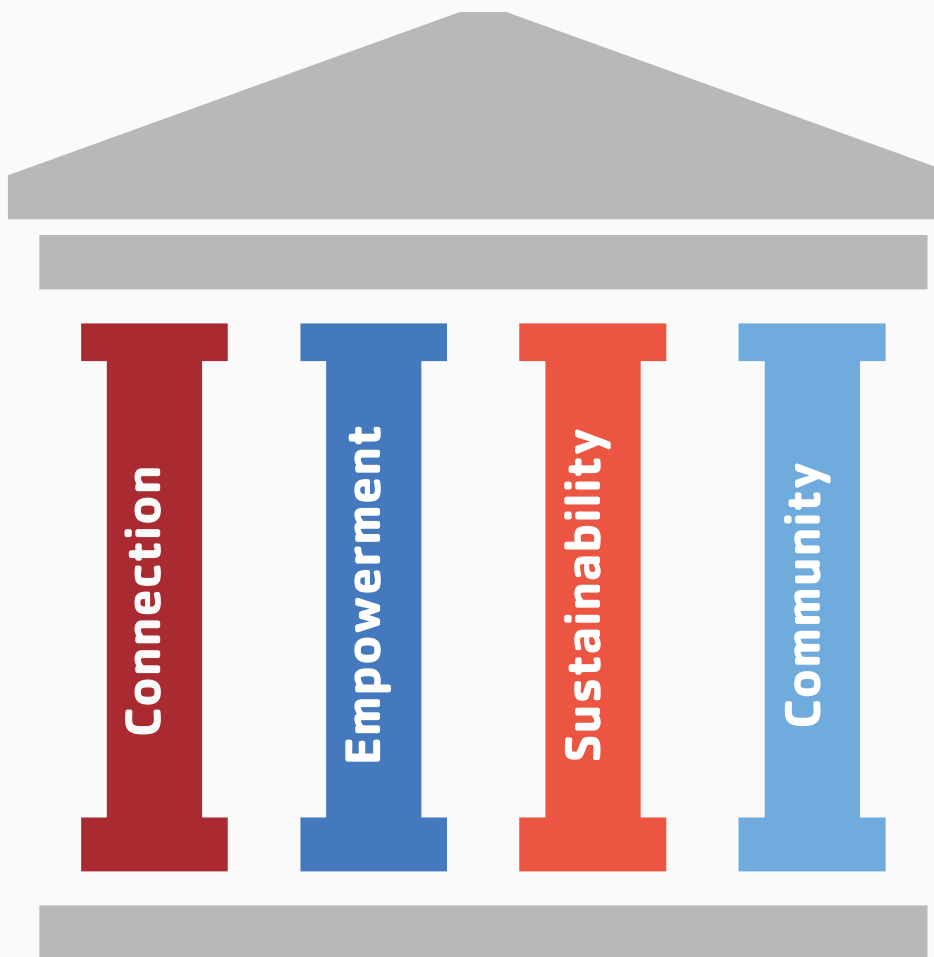

# NOURISHING FAMILIES. OPENING DOORS.

The Neighborhood Exchange (NEX) Food Distribution addresses food insecurity while creating meaningful connections for military families. Hosted in two of the nation's most densely populated military housing communities, Murphy Canyon and Bayview Hills, NEX provides **fresh food, essential household supplies, and access to vital support resources.**

Beyond meeting immediate needs, NEX often serves as a **first point of connection** for families, introducing them to ASYMCA San Diego's low- and no-cost programs that promote stability and resilience.

*"It's not just the fresh food that helps, it's the sense of community and support we feel every time we come. Being stationed far from home can be isolating, but here, we're reminded that we're not alone and that there are people who truly care about helping military families thrive."*



NEX also brings together nonprofit and community partners who provide **on-site resources**, such as financial education, workforce support, and family services. This collaborative approach ensures families leave not only with food, but with connections, knowledge, and opportunities that help them move forward with confidence.

At **pre-deployment briefings and homecoming events** across San Diego based, Armed Services YMCA San Diego is there offering comfort, connection, and steady support during some of the most emotional moments in a military family's journey.

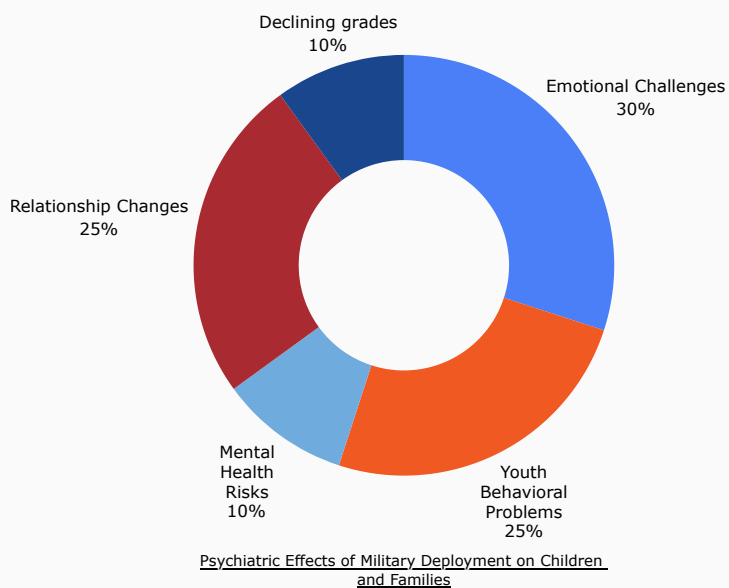


During pre-deployments, families are often navigating uncertainty, logistics, and the weight of impending separation. We **create welcoming spaces** where children can engage in meaningful activities while parents attend briefings and prepare for the months ahead. We **connect families** to available programs and resources, ensuring they know they are not alone.

At homecomings, we **celebrate alongside them**. Whether through family-friendly activities, resource tables, or simply a reassuring presence, we stand ready to **welcome service members home and support the reintegration process** for the entire family.

As families face the challenges of deployment and the relief of reunion, we ensure they know that their community is alongside them throughout their journey. In 2025 we supported 5000 military family members during pre-deployments and homecomings.

# RAPID RESPONSE. REAL IMPACT.

## URGENT RESPONSE SUPPORT

In May 2025, Armed Services YMCA San Diego responded to the tragic jet crash in Murphy Canyon military housing that affected and displaced over a 100 households and claimed the lives of 6 civilians. As the first military nonprofit on the scene, we have been referred to as the first responders of military nonprofits, a title we are honored to carry. We mobilized quickly with military commands and community partners to **provide emergency childcare, temporary lodging, transportation, financial assistance, and ongoing resource coordination.** Our newly built Center for Military Families stood as the epicenter for all emergency response activity, providing a safe, sheltered space that supported efficient emergency operations.

## ASSURED STABILITY THROUGH THE GOVERNMENT SHUTDOWN


During the government shutdown, uncertainty around potential pay disruptions created added stress for military families. In response, ASYMCA expanded food distributions and outreach efforts to ensure families had access to essential resources. At the height of the shutdown in 2025, **additional food and diaper distributions served 978 service member families.**



# PROMOTING HEALING & HOPE AT NMCS D

Naval Medical Center San Diego, Armed Services YMCA San Diego's Warrior Care Initiative serves wounded, injured, and ill service members during some of the most vulnerable moments of their military journey. Through thoughtfully designed activities, supportive interactions, and family-centered engagement, we create opportunities for encouragement and meaningful connection with volunteers throughout the recovery process.

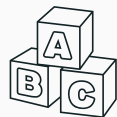

At **Horse of the Sun Ranch**, restoration and renewal take shape amid open space, steady movement, and the grounding presence of horses. Surrounded by the rhythms of the natural world, service members and their families engage in **equine-assisted experiences and outdoor learning** that invite reflection, confidence, and growth.

Through guided interaction with horses and time spent in nature, participants **develop emotional awareness, strengthen communication, and build trust** within themselves and with one another. The Ranch offers space to *reset, reconnect, and rediscover resilience* in an environment that feels both grounding and expansive.

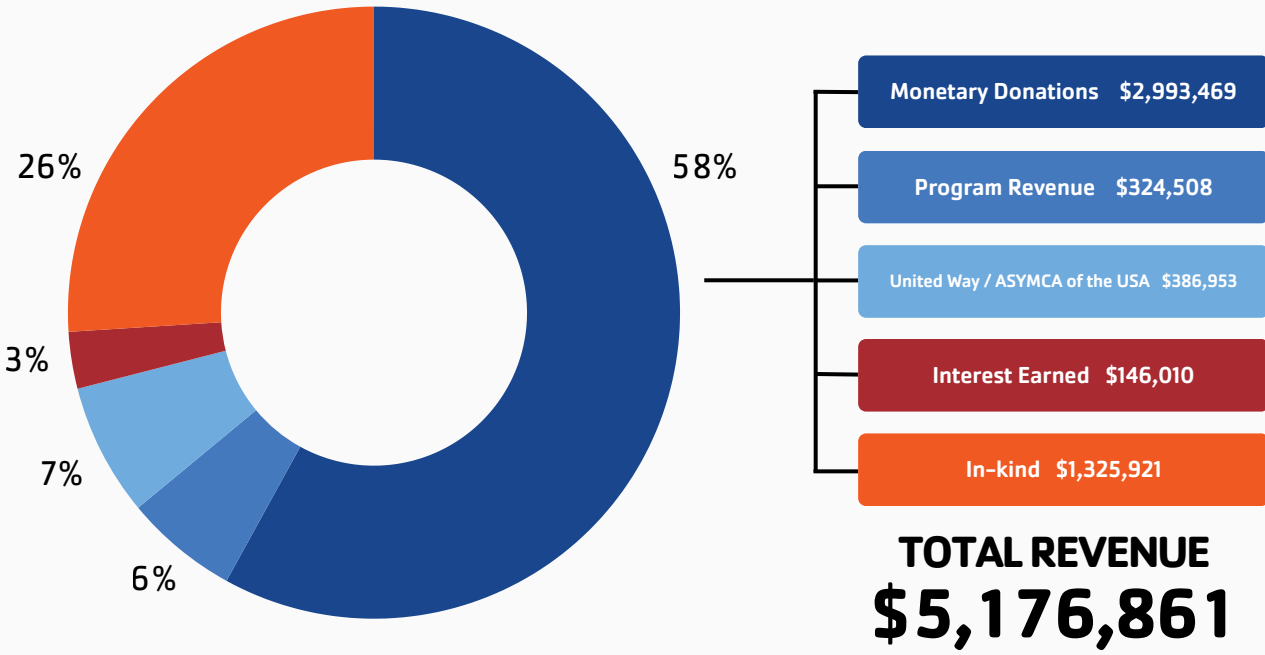
